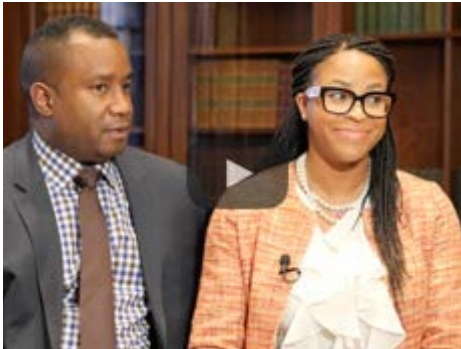
Welcome Adrian Prieto!

Nichole '90, L'92, L'93 and Rob Chappel '90, L'95



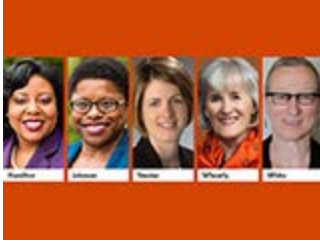
